Kelley Howell has been selling her delicious jams, jellies and sauces to help support the mission. In addition, the January Mission collection will be dedicated to the mission. The money collected on Mission Sunday will be used to purchase medicine, which we give to our patients at no cost during clinic. We see over 1000 patients in five days, and for many this the only time they see a physician all year.

PASTOR'S LETTER Dear Friends.



66 want to live again!" I George Bailey cried as he stood on a snow-covered iron bridge with the dark, swirling river below. With help from angel second class Clarence Oddbody, George had

just discovered to his horror what life would be like had he never been born. Anyone who has watched the Christmas film classic It's A Wonderful Life knows Bedford Falls had become Pottersville; its main street a red-light district with loud music and garish, fleshpeddling neon signs; the transformation from Currier and Ives to Sodom and Gomorrah-all because George had never been born.

One person can make an enormous difference in the lives of others, in a community, or in an entire culture. In an article by Dr. D. James Kennedy called "What if Christmas had never happened?" he raises the question, what if Jesus had never been born? What difference would it have made in history or in our daily lives if a Bethlehem stable had not served as a makeshift delivery room 2017 years ago?

Historically, it would have made a huge difference. Jesus has changed virtually every aspect of human life. Much of what we take for granted finds its roots in Christ and his teachings. The greatest tragedy of the Christmas holiday each year is not so much its commercialization, but its trivialization. Without even realizing it, we live as if He had never been born.

In our hearts we know that if Christmas had never happened the implications for our world would be horrific. The same is true if Christmas never happens in our own heart. A life lived without Christ is tragic.

My prayer for you as you enter this New Year of 2018 is that Christ has been or will be born in your heart. Have a blessed New Year.

ALTAR FLOWERS

On most Sundays, other than during Lent and Advent, our church altar is beautified by bouquets of flowers. By signing up in advance on the bulletin board by the kitchen door in the parish hall, you can reserve a Sunday to have flowers put on the altar in memory of or in thanksgiving for someone. A member of the Flower committee will call you to find out your wishes. After that you may pay for the flowers (one vase is \$35 and two vases are \$50) by putting the money in an envelope in the collection plate. Make sure it is clearly marked "Altar Flowers" with your name, the date, and the amount enclosed. After the 10 AM service on the Sunday you have reserved, you may take the flowers home or designate them to be given to a special person or shut-in.

- If you have your pledge automatically sent to the church from your bank, ensure your envelope number is on the check.
- Write the amount you've enclosed on the outside of your envelope along with "check" or "cash" as it pertains.
- If you miss church for a few weeks, you don't need to fill individual envelopes, but can put it all in one envelope.
- In your packet you will find envelopes for the building fund, which will be currently used for KidsFirst and can be filled anytime during the month.

Children's Church We are continuing with the Deep Blue Bible Study. Asia, Edgar, Kat, and Indigo are traveling around the world with the kids. We learn about



different cultures and learn more about God in a positive way. Every week the kids will receive a "booklet" containing the week's reading and corresponding activity sheets. We watch the video and then read it in the Deep Blue Bibles. The discussions are priceless. Kids say the most amazing things and have some really deep thoughts. There is a free app available on your smart devices to watch the videos, play the songs, and play games to reinforce the main themes that we are studying at home.

Families are encouraged to pick up the Family Weekly Devotion in the back of the church. We have a magazine rack where we keep the last two weeks' booklets and corresponding weekly devotions. There is a file box next to it with older sessions. Please help yourself to these and use them with your kids. If your kids are too shy or too young to come to children's church, the activity sheets are still fun for them. Also, the app has the videos, along with the family devotion sheet; they are a great way for you to teach your little ones all about God's love at home.

Kids are also encouraged to bring their own Bibles. For every week that they do, their name is put in an end-of-year drawing; they could win \$50. To get another entry, bring a non-perishable item for the food pantry. If the children don't have their own Bibles, please let us know. We will make sure to get them one.
