

PASTOR'S LETTER



THE REVEREND DERIK J. ROY, JR.

Dear Friends,

The recent discovery of documents attributed to the disciple Judas has provided some interesting discussions. Whether these documents are authentic or not is also debatable, however,

they got me thinking about Judas. Judas betrayed Christ and then when he realized the magnitude of his actions, he couldn't live with himself, and committed suicide.

There's a story that has always touched me about Judas. The story goes that on Judgment Day in heaven, everyone is joyfully celebrating, singing, dancing, and embracing their loved ones. That is, everyone except Jesus, who is standing sadly at the gates to Heaven, looking down to Earth. He is asked why he is not joining in the party and joy all around him and Jesus answers, "I am waiting for Judas."

I hope the power of that story touches you like it does me. God in Christ is such pure, forgiving love that he yearns to embrace his betrayer. In the Easter story all his followers let Him down, but because they knew Jesus would forgive, they were restored to fellowship with him. The same reunion awaits Judas.

In a very real way, each of us has sold out Christ many times and in many ways. Only the selfrighteous and proud among us could deny our guilt. We all have some Judas in us. Yet we are always welcome, even at the last moment.

What is good news to us, is that Jesus waits for us and will embrace us when we return. What is bad news, is that we have to choose and often we don't. Like Judas, we separate ourselves from God.

As we continue in this Easter season, choose the Risen Lord! He is waiting for you.

APRIL MISSIONS

The missions offering for the month of April will L support the ministry of Choshen Farm. Many of you had the opportunity to hear Bethany Colvin speak at this year's seder dinner about the vision, presence, and work of Choshen Farm in serving the Aushi Bemba people of Manasa District in Luapula Province, Zambia, Africa. She encouraged us with a message that reminded us of how, in our calling as children of God, the work of the Gospel is universal, and she shared about how Christ's Kingdom is transforming an area deeply burdened by generations of animistic worship of ancestral spirits. She spoke about how those who minister at Choshen farm act as chain-breakers, and peace-makers, bringing freedom for those enslaved to ways of doing things that perpetuate problems, and rooting deep in their community for the long haul of bringing transformation over time.

The mission of Choshen Farm is to impact rural Zambia for Christ through relational encouragement, community development, and strengthening of the local church. Choshen Farm seeks to break the chains of animism in Fimpulu, Zambia, which have resulted in poverty, food insecurity, lack of education, and spiritual oppression throughout the region where they minister. Choshen Farm engages in a variety of community-oriented programs to wholistically disciple and uplift their community toward theistic transformation, including: agriculture, education, local economic development, partnership with local churches, community health and AIDS programs, children's programs, and ministry to orphans and widows.

Choshen Farm was established in October 2006 when Jeremy Colvin followed the Lord's leading to Fimpulu, and pitched a tent in the bush with the help of a small group of South Africans. In 2007 he met Bethany who was serving with Peace Corps. Together, the Colvins have served as the chief strategists and visionary leaders of the operation as it has grown tremendously over the years. In order to accomplish the large quantity of work they do in a sustainable, culturally relevant, and indigenous manner, Choshen Farm relies largely on the inclusion of local staff and leadership. Jeremy and Bethany and their two young daughters

are the only non-Zambians in the local picture, and they seek to blend in. They were overjoyed to recently welcome their adopted son, Dominic, into their family.

Money given through our April offering will be used for capital development projects at Choshen Farm to expand their Fimpulu Christian Community Primary School, grow their existing conference center facilities due to increased demand from local groups and churches. They plan to develop the local road for ease of transport and facilitating development work in the region and to increase local food security.

Thank you for your support of these capital projects. Many other opportunities also exist to partner with this ministry, both financially and in prayer. For more details you can check out choshenfarm.org, or speak with me.
