PASTOR'S LETTER

THE REVEREND DERIK J. ROY, JR.

Dear Friends,

The call came early one morning from the hospital. A dying patient was asking for a minister. Half an hour later, the pastor was standing at the bedside of Felix Richy as a nurse drew a curtain around them. "Pastor," Mr.

Richy said, "My Uncle

tried to talk to me about the Lord, but I wouldn't listen. My wife tried to get me to go to church, but I wouldn't go. Now I am alone and about to meet my maker and my life has been filled with sin."

"You admit you've sinned and that's half the battle," the pastor said. Then the two of them talked about God's forgiveness, read scripture and prayed together, as the dying man turned his life over to the Lord.

The next day, the pastor returned. He returned again the next day, and the next. All along, Felix kept improving and in a matter of weeks, was sent home. Every Sunday for the next eight years Felix sat in the pew listening to the man who had brought Christ into his life. Eight years after that first encounter, Felix died suddenly of a heart attack.

After officiating at Felix's funeral, the Pastor saw an elderly man approach him. "You don't know me, but I was in the bed next to Felix when you came to the hospital eight years ago. I listened to what you said. What you don't know is that when you were hauling in the net with Felix in it, I jumped in too!"

We never know when a word or act of Christian love leaves an indelible mark on someone's life. It's perhaps a little easier to see in our individual lives, but it is also true in our life as a community of faith we call the Church. Our commitment of time, talent and money makes a difference in many people's lives. We often don't see the lives we touch with our gifts of love. The fact is, what we give touches many people in many different ways.

Thank you for what you give as a sign of your love for God and your belief in the church. Our church is a vibrant, alive, growing community, and with your continued support we will continue to touch others with God's love. ●

- Church History
- Theological and Moral Choices

HELPING THE COUNTERS

- If you have your pledge automatically sent to the church from your bank, ensure your envelope number is on the check.
- Write the amount you've enclosed on the outside of your envelope along with "check" or "cash" as it pertains.
- If you miss church for a few weeks you don't need to fill individual envelopes, but can put it all in one envelope.

- In your envelope packet you will find envelopes for the building fund, which will be currently used for KidsFirst and can be filled anytime during the month.

VESTRY PLANNING

The vestry held a planning retreat at the end of April and we wanted to summarize some of our findings for the Christ Episcopal Church family. Fr Derik did an excellent job of framing the discussion in prayer, bible study and honest conversation. Most of the vestry was able to attend the retreat from Friday night through Saturday to help map out our thoughts for the future direction of the church. A couple points were clear to us. Our mission continues to be a core focus for all our ministry activities; we feel like this helps us live out the Great Commandment (*Matthew 22:36-40*).

“A loving community seeking to know Jesus Christ and to make him known.”

We all felt that we should continue to improve in planning for the future of our church and its programs. Many of our ministry areas are going well but they do need diligent attention to ensure they are healthy and continuing to live out our mission to the community and the world. Fr Derik has organized our ministry areas into 3 broad categories: Outreach, Pastoral and Resource. You can see an example of the various ministries below with their respective vestry leaders.

- Outreach (Alan Greenspan)
- Food Pantry, Noah's Attic, Kids First, Evangelism, Missions...
- Pastoral (Cathy Hughes)
- Worship, Education, Fellowship, Caring Ministries, Personal Growth
- Resource (Christine Comish-Osgood)
- Administration, Staffing, Stewardship, Building & Grounds, Memorials, Columbarium

KidsFirst is one of our newest ministry efforts, and an example of how we are learning and improving. It has been a blessing to the Ballston Spa community by providing families with childcare for several years now, and we thank Fr Derik and Dennis Crimi for their vision of what KidsFirst could bring to Ballston Spa. This past year, we continued to build the enrollment of KidsFirst programs and improve cash flow of the business. Our efforts have taken some time but are bearing fruit. We are near full capacity in KidsFirst and have been working with the bank to restructure some of the building loans to take advantage of lower interest rates. Many of these changes will enable KidsFirst and our combined finances to reach a healthier state and

continue to be a blessing to families and their children. We are so thankful for Jennifer Hidalgo (KidsFirst Director), the KidsFirst staff, and the Board of Directors for partnering with Christ Church to provide a much-needed service to young families in the Ballston Spa area.

In some of our other ministry areas, we would like to look forward and firm up a 3-5 year plan so we can map out the projection for how Christ Church can support these programs. If you are involved with one of the Christ Church ministry efforts, you may be asked to prayerfully brainstorm some thoughts about what God is calling us to do in the future. Several bold initiatives surfaced in our discussions:

- Consider adding a half-time or full-time minister to complement Fr Derik's skills. This individual will add other worship opportunities and share ministry and administrative duties with Fr Derik. You may not realize this, but Fr Derik has 30 individuals reporting to him through the various church staff, employees and volunteers. An added position would be a blessing to Fr Derik and help him share the load, while opening up growth opportunities.
- Communicate, communicate, communicate! Use our website, Facebook, email and other social media to share information and let others see what life is like in our church family. We realize that many parishioners like the regular mailing through the USPS. We would also like to utilize more avenues to reach out to the congregation and potential new members.
- Evaluate ministry changes. If you are involved in leading a sub-ministry, please be thinking about a 3-5 year plan that you can share with Alan, Cathy, or Christine as your ministry area leaders. If you are in the congregation and part of Christ Church community, please consider how you might be a blessing to our neighbors by supporting through your time, talents or treasure. Our outreach, pastoral and resource ministry groups are a great place to explore your faith, grow new friendships and bless those around us!

The vestry was energized by the retreat, but we can't do this alone. Please keep Fr Derik and the vestry in prayer that we may continue to be a blessing to each other, the community and the world. And most important, please continue to pray and reflect on what you might be called to get involved in. There are so many ways to be a blessing to our neighbors. Seek and you will find, ask and you will receive, get involved and you'll be blessed! ●
