At the end of his tour, he left active duty, went to seminary and became an Episcopal minister, serving as a chaplain in the Air Force until he retired from military service. He then served as the pastor at Calvary Church in Burnt Hills, and later as the suffragan bishop of our diocese. After his time in our diocese, he became a bishop in the Anglican Church of North America.

Cancer was a huge trial for everyone including the patient and the family and friends who love him. Even now Mike says, "I should not have lived."

His quilt was made with a John Deere theme. Now, we are fortunate to receive the fabric that is donated to Noah's Attic to craft quilts. They can come in any variety of designs and colors. Noah's fabric is a great plus for us as the requests for quilts can be as many as 3 or 4 a week.

Anyone can request a Prayer Quilt at any time. You will find request forms in the Welcome Center attached to our sign.

Other activities of the group include going to St Augustine's School in Mechanicville to assist the kindergarten class with the "Letter Q." When they study the letter "Q" we use the leftover fabric from making their "Show and Tell" bags to make a quilted pillow that will go with them until they graduate from high school.
