### PASTOR'S LETTER



The Reverend Derik J. Roy, Jr.

Dear Friends in Christ, √√γe have entered the season of Epiphany. "Big deal!" you might be thinking. What does Epiphany have to do with reality? And besides, the

Church may call this

season Epiphany but we all know it is really the season of winter, and it's cold.

The truth is, Epiphany is a big deal and has a lot to do with reality and life. Let me explain. The word epiphany means to manifest, or to show forth, or to be revealed. The season of Epiphany begins with the magi from the East following the star to Bethlehem to worship the newborn King. This fact is significant for many reasons but most of all as an acknowledgment that they recognized Jesus to be the Messiah. Their action manifested to the world that Jesus was the Christ, not only for a few but for all. Throughout the rest of the season of Epiphany, which leads us to the season of Lent, the Scriptures focus on how Jesus is revealed to the world as the Savior. The first Sunday of Epiphany begins with the Baptism of Jesus and the affirmation from His Father saying, "This is my beloved son, with whom I am well pleased." The season culminates on the last Sunday of Epiphany with Jesus on the mountain of Transfiguration and the voice of His Father affirms, "This is my beloved Son." What all this means to us is everything. First, it is a season meant to remind us that Jesus is the Christ, the Messiah, the King, our Savior. We know that in an intellectual way, but seemingly forget it in terms of the way we live. We get easily get distracted, letting other things, issues, or people have more influence and power over us than Him. Second, we as Christians are called to be "like Christ" and we need to be challenged to ask ourselves if we are living our lives in such a way that we're manifesting, showing forth, and revealing Christ to others.

I pray that you'll prayerfully consider Epiphany in this light. For it is a big deal, and to follow His star can bring warmth even if it is winter.

### Support Noah's Attic!

I was hanging clothes upstairs at Noah's Attic the other day when a young lady spoke quietly with Laura Face at the counter. She asked for help and showed Laura the required ID. Since she hadn't been at Noah's before, Laura had to fill out a card for her.

Laura asked, "Is this your current address?"

The lady replied, "No, I got kicked out of my apartment yesterday, I have no place to live right now. I'm headed to social services after this to find a place."

Laura asked, "Do you live by yourself?"

"No," she said, "I have a 2 year-old boy, too."

Laura somehow completed the paperwork and the lady spent a half-hour or so selecting clothes for herself and her child.

You can think that this lady really needs to get in charge of her life, and that there must be a reason for her getting kicked out of her apartment. On the other hand, somewhere out there is a 2 year-old who's relying on his mom. In October, 2019, Noah's Attic gave 268 bags of free clothes to needy people. Some of these people needed clothes more than others, certainly, but some really do need the clothes. For those buying clothes, we sell items for \$1 or so. All proceeds support the church.

It's a lot of work to keep Noah's Attic running. We need volunteers to receive, sort, hang, and display all the clothes and other household donations we receive every day. Most of the workers are retired, and some of them and some of their family members have had health issues. Some of them need time off now and then. As a result, Noah's has had to close its doors for a day here and there.

Please consider helping at Noah's Attic. A few hours a month from a few people would make a big difference. Enough volunteers will help our doors stay open to help a 2 year-old and his mom. You can stop in during normal business hours and see Wanda Closson, the director, or Donna Hatley, the assistant.

n "Breathing Under Water," Richard Rohr Lexplains how the Gospel principles in the 12 steps can free anyone from addiction; from substance use disorder, to the more common but less visible addiction we have to sin.

### HELLO FROM BELIZE

s you read this, your mission team is either headed to Belize or are there now enjoying the warm climate. However, we are not lying on a beach, and we don't have an unlimited supply of Caribbean drinks. What we are doing is making a difference in the lives of the people of Mt Hope Bible Church and the village of Unitedville, Belize.

This is our second mission trip to Mt Hope. Last year our primary project was insulating and finishing the second story of their new Youth Center. This year we are finishing two Sunday School rooms that are below the Youth Center. We are also building a small bedroom addition on the home of a parishioner who is a single mother of two.

Several of our team members are educators by trade and are going into a local school to work with the teachers and students. We've had a huge success when collecting supplies for our trip. We have more than 2,000 pencils. We have dozens of hand held pencil sharpeners and even enough wall mounted pencil sharpeners to install one in each classroom of the school—a luxury for Belizean classrooms.

Last year, we had team members from three Churches. This year, people have joined us from Adirondack Missions Church, Church of the Messiah in Glens Falls, Greenfield Center Baptist Church, and Trinity Church of Lansingburgh.
